During a recent visit, Cathy shared how that support made a bigger impact than she ever expected. With the money she was able to save on groceries, she purchased a reliable

car – something she hadn't had in years. Now, with dependable transportation, she's taken the next big step: enrolling in classes to earn her associate's degree. What started as a little help with food has opened the door to a brighter, more stable future.

John wasn't sure what he wanted to do after high school, which made it hard to stay motivated in class. That started to change when he began attending presentations from guest speakers with different career backgrounds. Hearing about their experiences



opened his eyes to a variety of jobs; some he found interesting, and others he knew weren't for him. He started exploring a few career paths more deeply and even got the chance to talk with people working in those fields. That real-world insight helped him see what those jobs are really like and gave him a reason to keep pushing through school. While school is still challenging for John, participating in a United Way career exploration program has helped him stay engaged and believe in his future.
